The Master of School Administration (MSA) program provides full-time and part-time scheduling options to prepare experienced educators for prominent school and district leadership roles. Our licensure-granting curriculum combines research-based practices with real-world contexts, with a focus on equity, social justice, and improvement sciences. With flexible options available, the MSA program accommodates the schedules of students who continue to work full- or part-time while earning the degree.

Our MSA graduates move into leadership positions in schools and districts, while others assume influential roles within state, regional and national organizations focused on professional learning, advocacy, and/or policy development.

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Our program offers multiple scheduling options to accommodate full-time and part-time students.

## MSA Flex (Summer Start)

- Full-time, two-year model that blends face-to-face and digital learning
- Summer, fall and spring semesters
- 9 credit hours per semester plus year-long internship
- Cohort-based

## Add-On Licensure (Part-Time)

- No degree issued
- Must have earned a master's degree prior to application period
- Must complete within 5 years
