The Policy, Leadership, and School Improvement (PLS) concentration of our Ph.D. in Education program prepares its students to conduct rigorous research into the social, political, and economic conditions affecting schools, and to recommend policy solutions that are effective, socially just, and technically sound.

Our students gain the analytic skills to discern ideological from empirical questions and to investigate pressing educational problems. Students also learn conceptual and analytic approaches from economics, political science, and sociology, and complete intermediate and advanced courses in cutting-edge methods of educational research.

Throughout their time in the program, students have opportunities to work closely with faculty members on ongoing research projects, further developing research skills.

The PLS concentration of the Ph.D. in Education program also provides its students opportunities to:

- Explore education's most pressing and persistent problems including, but not limited to, teacher quality, turn-around schools, high school effectiveness, resource allocation, principal instructional leadership, and issues of class, gender, immigration, and race in education
- Collaborate with engaged scholars who are currently working with the school districts and state departments of education across the United States as well as the U.S. Department of Education's Institute for Education Science on a range of issues related to post-pandemic educational recovery, teacher labor markets, and student transitions to higher education, among others

PLS faculty members are committed to providing students with funding, including tuition, health insurance, and a living stipend.
